Dear Parents/Guardians,

As we reflect on the vibrant activities and achievements of the past two months, it is with great pleasure that I share with you the multitude of enriching experiences that have filled our school with joy and accomplishment. Coicís na Gaeilge: We commenced March with Coicís na Gaeilge, a fortnight dedicated to embracing and celebrating the Irish language. From the 1st to the 15th of March, our school buzzed with enthusiasm as all classes immersed themselves in various activities aimed at promoting Gaeilge and fostering a deep appreciation for our rich linguistic heritage. During Coicís na Gaeilge, our classrooms transformed into vibrant Gaeilge stations, where students actively engaged in languageenhancing tasks and games. The younger students were delighted to welcome their older peers, who adeptly conversed with them using our charming 'pupéidí', enriching their

language skills through interactive exchanges.

A highlight of our celebration was the involvement of Raidió na Gaeltachta, where each class showcased their linguistic prowess by performing songs and poems in Gaeilge over the intercom, captivating the entire school with their talent and dedication.

On the 5th of March, we had the pleasure of hosting Transition Year pupils from the Presentation Secondary School, who treated us to a delightful array of Irish songs and tunes, infusing our school with the joyous spirit of traditional Irish music. The céilí they organised was a resounding success, providing our children with an unforgettable experience.

The culmination of Coicís na Gaeilge was our spectacular Lá Glas whole school concert on the 15th of March. It was heartening to witness every class wholeheartedly participating, with each group delivering enchanting performances in the form of songs, poems, dances, and dramas, all as Gaeilge. The event truly showcased the depth of talent and the strong sense of community that defines our school.I extend my heartfelt gratitude to Ms. Kennedy for her exceptional coordination of our Coicís na Gaeilge activities.

Peace Proms: Our participation in the Peace Proms on 2nd March was a highlight for our 3rd and 4th class pupils, who travelled to WIT Arena to join the Cross Border Orchestra in this remarkable event. Professional development remains a priority for our staff, and I am pleased to report that on the 17th of April, we welcomed Niamh Gleeson from NCSE to facilitate a training workshop on the Autism Good Practice Guidance. Additionally, we have scheduled a school closure day on Thursday, the 9th of May, to facilitate staff training in the new Primary Maths Curriculum. Sporting Achievements: In the realm of sports, our Cumann na mBunscoil camogie teams have demonstrated outstanding skill and teamwork. Our Under 13 and U11 teams showcased their prowess in April, with notable successes in their matches. Fyffes Fittest School: The excitement continues with our participation in the Fyffes Fittest School Competition, where our children have been honing their Fundamental Movement Skills and skill development. Under the guidance of Ms. Curran, our students have excelled, earning us a place in the live finals in Dublin on the 24th of May. Congratulations to Ms. Curran and all our students for their hard work. As we advance to the live final, the school will receive at least €1000 worth of new sports equipment. Creative Cluster: We are currently in Year 2 of our Creative Cluster project. We have recently purchased 25 ukuleles for the school as part of this initiative. Our 3rd class pupils will begin a block of 5 week's lessons with Seamus Hennessy on 16th May. This is something that we plan on rolling out to other classes from next year.

Our **Hot Meals** program, which began on the 22nd of April, has been a resounding success. The children are enjoying a variety of foods, and we anticipate that by September, each child will have a good understanding of their preferences. We recommend continuing to provide extra snacks for your child as they adjust to new foods. Student Attendance: Our ongoing goal is to enhance attendance in every class on a monthly basis. At the conclusion of each month, the class demonstrating the highest overall attendance and the most significant improvement in attendance will receive a special reward as recognition for their dedication. Should your child be unable to attend school due to illness, please ensure to provide the reason for their absence through the attendance return feature on Aladdin. It's important to note that students who accumulate more than 20 days of absence will be automatically reported to the Tusla Education Support Service.
